**VILLAGE OF VALEMOUNT
MUNICIPAL TICKET INFORMATION BYLAW NO. 641, 2009**

Being a Bylaw of the Village of Valemount to establish a Municipal Ticket Information System.

WHEREAS, the *Community Charter* authorizes a Council to establish, by By-law, a means to designate those Municipal By-laws which may be enforced by way of a municipal ticketing system, the offences which are subject to municipal ticketing, who is empowered to issue municipal tickets and what fines may be imposed for each offence.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Village of Valemount, in open meeting lawfully assembled, hereby enacts as follows;

1. Those by-laws, as amended or replaced from time to time, listed in Column 1 of Schedule 'A' of this By-law may be enforced by means of a ticket in the form prescribed in Section 273 of the *Community Charter*.
2. In Schedule 'A' of this By-law, those persons appointed to the job positions or titles listed in Column 2 are hereby designated a By-law Enforcement Officers under Section 264 of the *Community Charter* for the purpose of enforcing the By-laws listed in Column 1 of Schedule 'A'.
3. The words or expressions set forth in Column 1 of Schedule 'B', and as amended, designate the offence committed under the bylaw section number appearing opposite in Column 2.
4. The amounts appearing in Column 3 of Schedules 'B1' – 'B5' of this Bylaw, and as amended, are the fines set for the corresponding offences designated in Column 1.
5. A sample "Municipal Ticket Information" and "Certificate of Service" are attached as Exhibit '1' and Exhibit '2' respectively.
6. This By-law may be cited as all purposes as "Village of Valemount Municipal Ticket Information By-law No. 641, 2009.
