Emergency Planning Open House

Registration for the service will be available Friday, June 7th at the Centennial Park Safety 1st Information tables from 5 pm until 8 pm, and Saturday, June 8th at the Community Hall from 12 noon until 4 pm.

It's a Toilet Not A Trash Can!

It may be tempting to flush just about anything down the toilet, but doing so risks damage to septic tanks, the sewage treatment plant, and can cost you thousands in plumbing repairs.

What **NOT** to flush down the toilet:

- Feminine hygiene products
- Cooking grease/food
- Baby wipes, wet wipes, cleaning pads
- Diapers
- Dental floss
- Q-tips, cotton balls
- Paper towels/tissues

- Pills
- Cigarette butts

So what can you flush down the toilet? Toilet paper and Human waste should be the only things you flush.
