

# Cemetery Maintenance

---

The Village asks that the number of mementos and floral arrangements placed on grave spaces be limited, so as not to interfere with regular mowing and maintenance of the cemetery. If the size or number of items on a grave space is such that they interfere with maintenance, or the items are in very poor condition they will be removed.

Residents are also reminded that the planting of flowers, trees or shrubs, or the installation of fencing or railings in the cemetery is not permitted other than by an employee of the Village of Valemount. All unpermitted items will be removed by Public Works staff.

## Reminders to Residents

---

- The Village utilizes the easements and boulevards within all residential areas for snow clearing operations throughout the winter. Storing vehicles of any kind (including RV's, boats, utility trailers etc) or materials such as dirt, gravel, firewood, etc within Village easements and boulevards is in contravention of Village Bylaws. Violations may result in fines or vehicles being towed at the owners expense should they hinder snow removal efforts. - Pets, including cats and dogs are not permitted to run at large within the Village. Pets found running at large may be subject to a fine as per the Village of Valemount Animal Control Bylaw.

The Wood Stove Exchange Program offers rebates to change out your old wood stove for a cleaner burning wood stove or alternative heating source

**Rebates:**

**EPA/CSA certified Wood Replacement: \$1,250**

**Pellet Stove, Propane Appliance or Electric Heat Pump: \$2,500**

**Did you know?**

- New EPA/CSA certified wood burning appliances generate less smoke and emit fewer particles than a non-certified stove and use less wood (about 25% less) to create more heat.
