Condition: To become certified, a site **must** have a public entrance, and all its key functional spaces and amenities, can be physically accessed by everyone.

2. Follow the breakdown for each category to identify key areas of strength and/or improvement.

The RHFAC Rating Scorecard outlines points received for each category and its elements within the rating survey. Comparing earned to available points and reviewing your key areas of improvement from your RHFAC Professional will reveal where you can improve meaningful access.

3. Plan for next steps.
